Testolone is banned by the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) and the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA). TESTOLONE, also known as RAD-140, is a selective androgen receptor modulator (SARM) that has shown promising results in promoting muscle growth and improving strength, without the negative side effects usually associated with traditional anabolic steroids.
